



Riding Client Information during Covid-19

We are pleased to be able to offer riding lessons again and ask our riding clients to do the following to help protect everyone during this time;

- Please use the hand sanitiser at the front gate when you arrive and stay in the car park area until it is time for your lesson.
- If you bring anyone with you, they will need to remain in the car.
- Please wear gloves when riding and if possible, bring your own whip with you if it's needed.
- Your horse will be tacked up and brought out of the stable barn by your instructor so you can meet them in the riding arena.
- Where possible, we will be riding in the outdoor arena.
- Your instructor will be following the social distancing requirements during your lesson, so you may need to alter your own stirrup leathers and girth if this is required after mounting.
- You are welcome to wear a facemask when riding should you wish to.
- After riding, if you would like to book another lesson please ask your instructor to book this in for you or if you prefer, you can text or e-mail beth (bethmaloney2@gmail.com) to arrange it.
- There is hand wash and sanitiser available for you to use in the feedroom on the main yard if you would like to wash your hands when you arrive or leave the yard.
- If you have any questions or concerns please do speak to Beth.

We will be wiping down all school horse tack and any equipment used with alcohol wipes after each ride. We are also wiping down all door and gate handles with bleach every evening to minimise the risk of contamination.

To help protect everyone we ask that if you or any one you live with feel unwell, display a high temperature or have a continuous cough before coming on site, please let us know and do not visit the yard

We will be monitoring the situation and following advice from Public Health England and the Government in order to limit the risk of contamination to all who use our facilities.
